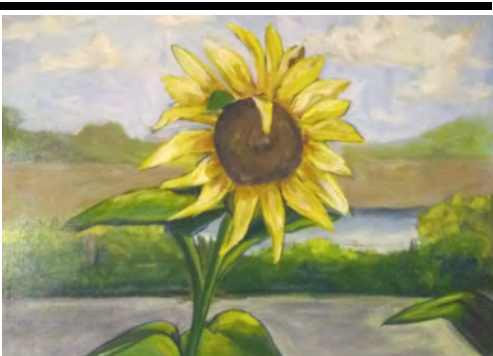

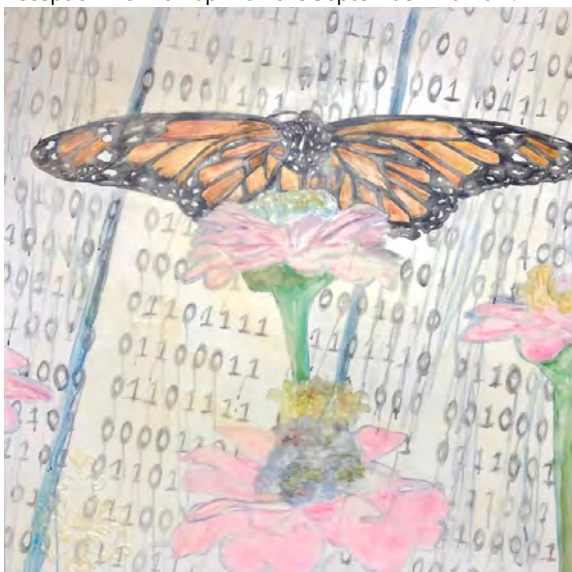
OBELISK HOME PRESENTS ARTIST KAT ALLIE

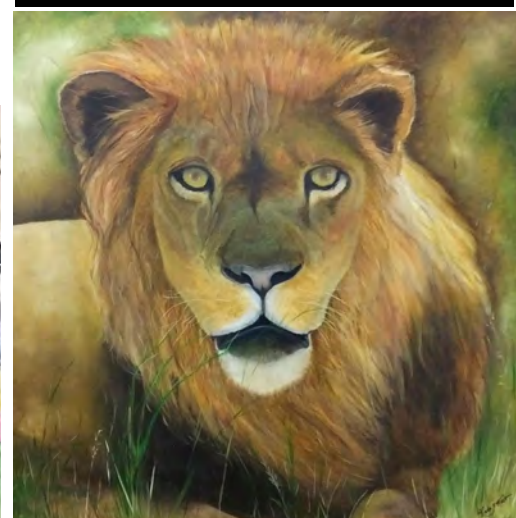


TUMBLE 2019

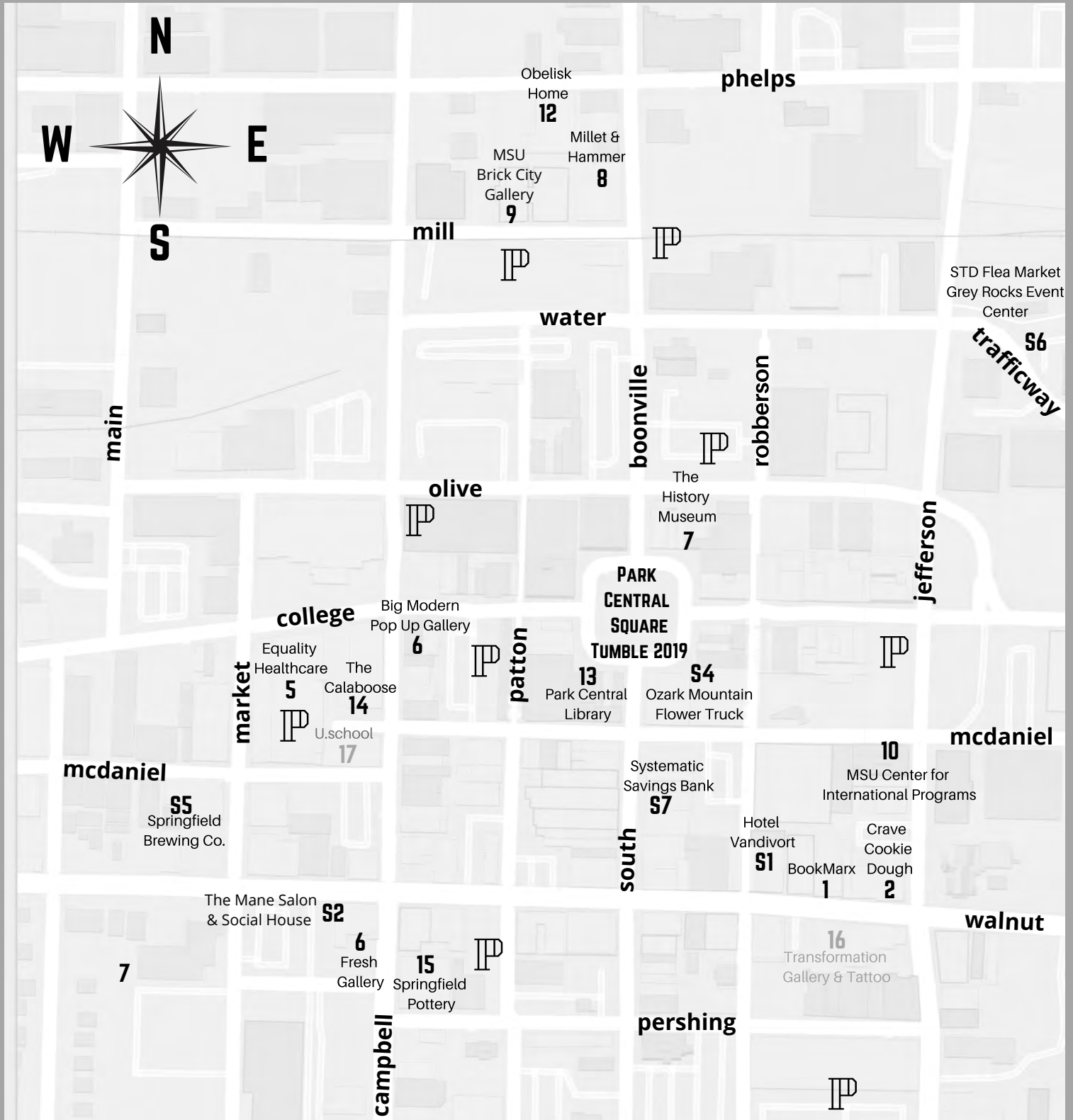
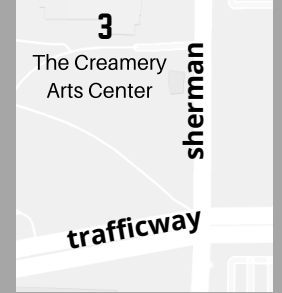


DOWNTOWN ARTS DISTRICT MAP
